School Drop Off/Collection: School Drop Off/Collection: Many thanks for your continued co-operation with our drop off and collection procedures. The school day is from 8.50 am – 2.30 pm (Infant home time is 1.30 pm). Please ensure that your child is on time for school. The school gates and doors will be closed at 9.10 am. Arriving on time helps your child settle into the day smoothly and ensures they benefit fully from the learning experiences planned.

<u>Swimming Lessons</u>: Lessons for <u>1</u>st/<u>2</u>nd/<u>3</u>rd/<u>4</u>th class will begin on <u>Thursday November 6</u>th for a 6-week block. Our time slot is <u>11.45 am</u>. Lessons are 40 minutes in duration and will take place in Aura Leisure, Drogheda. On swimming days, the children in 1st-4th may wear their school tracksuits. They will need their swimming costume and a hat for the lessons. They will also need to bring a towel with them to dry themselves. If you feel that your child may need help getting changed, you are welcome to go to the pool and assist them. The lessons will be at a cost of <u>€50 per child</u> regardless of weeks missed/absent. Our <u>Designated Liaison Person</u> is Lorraine O'Loughlin and our <u>Designated Deputy Liaison Person</u> is Kate Leddy. <u>School Closure:</u> The school will be closed to pupils on <u>Tuesday December 2nd</u> to facilitate staff training in the area of Child protection.

Healthy Eating: Please continue to pack a healthy lunch for your child. Fizzy drinks are not allowed in school. A copy of our "Healthy Eating Policy" can be found under the policies tab on the school website. Crisps and chocolate should not be sent to school for lunch. Scoil Cholmcille is a "Nut Free Zone" as we have a student with a nut allergy. We cannot allow children to bring any nut based products into school or in their packed lunches. We ask that parents avoid giving children peanuts, peanut butter sandwiches, other spreads containing nuts such as Nutella and snacks/bars containing nuts or labelled "may contain nut traces" in school lunches. We also ask children not to share their lunches.

<u>Children's Choir:</u> Duleek Parish Children's Choir will take place in St Cianán's Church, Duleek on Saturday 1st November 2025 at 6.15pm, in preparation for 7.00pm Mass. New members are always welcome to come along. The masses this weekend are designated masses for the First Holy Communion and Confirmation children. They will receive their first sticker for their sacramental passport at these masses.

<u>Birthday Invitations/Treats</u>: The school encourages parents to be mindful of other children and their feelings if you are inviting a select few to a birthday party. If this is the case, we ask that you distribute birthday invitations in private and outside of school. This is to avoid unnecessary upset to children. We also ask that you do not send treats/cakes into school to mark your child's birthday as we cannot distribute them.

School Attendance: Your child's attendance at school is very important for their progress. Please remember to message the teacher if your child is absent for whatever reason. Absences over 20 days must be reported to TUSLA. Reminder texts regarding absences are sent when a child reaches 15 days. We kindly ask that parents do not send their child to school if they are at all unwell or off form and to be mindful of absences when taking discretionary days e.g. holidays. A campaign designed to promote the importance of attendance at class/school level has been rolled out by Tusla Education Support Services (TESS) and the Department of Education and will run throughout the 2025/26 school year. As a school, we are asked to highlight the importance of school attendance. Thank you in advance for your continued co-operation.
